Program Schedule:

Program participants are permitted to work up to 20 hours per week during the fall and spring semesters, and up to 37.5 hours per week during the summer (from June-August). The SCA's standard business hours are 8:00 am-5:00 pm Monday to Friday. The internship is slated to begin during or after January and has the potential of continuing throughout the student's academic studies. The internship position is an in person position.
